SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 World Sailing Offshore Special Regulations Appendix B Special Regulations for inshore races shall apply.
- 1.3 All boats in all classes shall carry a functioning VHF radio.
- 1.4 All boats shall comply with Federal and State safety requirements.
- 1.5 Boats racing in One Design classes shall comply with the appropriate Class Rules.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

2.1 Notices will be placed online at https://www.regattaman.com/new_event_page.php?race_id=878.

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted before 09:00 on the day of the race, except that any change to the schedule of the races will be posted by 20:00 on the day before it will take effect.
- 3.2 Changes may be made to the Sailing Instructions on the water by the Race Committee (RC) per RRS 90.2(c). The change will be announced on the VHF radio channel 72. This changes RRS Race Signals.

4. SCHEDULE

- 4.1 Skippers' Meeting will be held at 12:00 in the BHYC.
- 4.2 First Warning signal Saturday is scheduled for 13:00.

5. COURSES all announcements by radio

- 5.1 Races will start in the area between the Coast Guard Buoy outside the BHYC mooring field (Mark N) and the Spruce Point Buoy (Mark K), depending on conditions. When possible, races will start in the vicinity of McKown Point.
- 5.2 The RC Signal Vessel will announce the course by VHF radio.
- 5.3 The Race Committee will try to have one course for all boats. If the race committee determines the need for a long and a short race there will be two courses. All boats will start in the same sequence for the short race.
- 5.4 Unless noted all marks shall left to port.
- 5.5 Laminated course charts are available at the BHYC Ships Store for \$10.00. NOTE: New charts were printed in 2022. For the most recent information please use a current race chart. Race charts are not to be used for navigation purposes.

5.7 AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

- 5.7.1 Boats shall not sail between mark "A" and the Cuckolds when mark "A" is not a designated mark of the course.
- 5.7.2 Boats shall not sail between mark "J" and Ocean Point when mark "J" is not a designated mark of the course.
- 5.7.3 Boats shall not sail between Fisherman's Island and The Hypocrites.
- 5.7.4 Boats shall not sail between Fisherman's Island and Ram Island.
- 5.7.5 Boats shall not sail between Tumbler Island and Spruce Point.

6. THE START

Races will be started in accordance with RRS 26. The Race Committee may announce at the Skipper's Meeting the Appendix U audible 3-minute start may be used for one or more classes if few boats assemble.

- 6.2 The Race Committee may announce at the Skipper's Meeting that one or more races will use pursuit start as described below. The Race Committee will try to have at least one day of the series use pursuit starts. If a pursuit start is announced, the Race Committee will announce the start order by radio.
- 6.3 If a pursuit start is to be used, after warning, the first boat is to start in 5 minutes. Then each boat has its determined start based on PHRF. The RC Signal Vessel boat will try to give each boat a one-minute warning by radio and will sound a horn for each start based on GPS time. The first boat to start (the highest rated boat) will be given the standard starting sequence as shown below:

Warning	5:00	One	Code Flag "BHYC" Raised	*
Preparatory	4:00	One	Code Flag "P" Raised	*
One Minute	1:00	One Long	Code Flag "P" Lowered	*
Start	0:00	One	Code Flag "BHYC" Lowered	

- During a pursuit start, the remaining boats will start at the time shown on the scratch sheet for the announced course. The Race Committee will endeavor to advise competitors of their starting times 1 minute prior to the appropriate time and may give further count downs from 1 minute. Failure to do so or mistake in these warnings shall not be grounds for redress of any kind.
- 6.5 During a pursuit start, all boats should remain clear of the starting area until they are next in sequence.

7. STARTING and FINISH LINE

- 7.1 The approximate location of the starting area will be announced at the skippers' meetings and on VHF Channel 72 prior to the first race.
- 7.2 Unless otherwise announced, the starting line will be between a staff displaying an ORANGE flag on the Race Committee Signal Vessel and an inflatable mark.
- 7.3 A limiting mark may be streamed from or near the signal vessel. Boats striking this limiting mark or sailing between the mark and the signal vessel will be considered in violation of **RRS 31**.
- 7.4 Boats not in the starting sequence shall avoid the close proximate starting area.
- 7.5 The Finish Line shall be between a solid BLUE flag on the RC Signal vessel and a nearby mark. The BLUE flag shall be on the side of the RC Signal Vessel closest to the finishing mark. If the flag is on the starboard side of the committee vessel, boats shall pass that side of the boat to finish.

8. CHANGES TO THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

8.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the next mark (or finish line) to a new position.

9. PENALTY SYSTEM

9.1 For this race ONLY the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced with One-Turn Penalty, this changes the first sentence of **RRS 44.1.**

10. TIME LIMIT

- The time limit for the first boat to sail the course and finish is 16:00. Boats failing to finish by 17:00 or within 60 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes (whichever is earlier) will be scored Did Not Finish, without hearing, changing rules 35, A4 and A5.
- 10.2 The race committee reserves the right to shorten the course if needed. Any and all announcements to be by radio

11. PROTESTS

- 11.1 Protests must be filed on a protest form within 30 minutes after the RC Signal Boat has docked.
- 11.2 Intention to protest must be indicated to the Race Committee at the time of finishing.
- **11.3** RRS Appendix T Sections B and D shall apply.

12. SCORING

12.1 Boats will be scored according to their corrected time on course as calculated by the PHRF handicapping system. The Race Committee will make best efforts to determine a reasonable PHRF rating for boats lacking a valid PHRF certificate.

13. RADIO COMMUNICATION

13.1 The race committee will monitor **VHF channel 72** for emergency transmissions. The race committee will also be using **VHF channel 72** for working communications and may employ an "open mike" policy. Boats may monitor **VHF channel 72** but are advised that any race committee communications are unofficial and made either for race management purposes or as a courtesy to the competitors.

14. SAFETY

- 14.1 Boats shall check-in with the Race Committee before the start of the race by sailing past the stern of the RC signal vessel on starboard tack and **hailing their sail number and number of people on board** and receiving confirmation from the Race Committee, alternatively a boat may call the RC on Channel 72 with the same information, check-in must be acknowledged by the RC Signal boat.
- 14.2 A boat that retires shall notify the RC as soon as possible.

15. PRIZES AND TROPHIES

15.1 Awards for the first three boats will be part of the sailing awards on or about August 31.

16. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

16.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entire at their own risk. See **RRS 4, Decision to Race**. The organizing authority accepts no liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

17. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000 per incident or the equivalent.

18. RACE OFFICIALS

- 18.1 RC Principal Race Officer (PRO) Race Committee Chair Scott Blake or appointee.
- 18.2 Protest Committee Chair PC Liz Rettenmaier plus appointee.
